

Job Title: Biodiversity Assistant

Location of Job: Carshalton, South London

An exciting volunteer opportunity has arisen with Sutton Nature Conservation Volunteers (SNCV) and Sutton Council's Biodiversity Team. This trainee position is an excellent opportunity for a motivated individual with a keen interest in nature conservation to gain further valuable experience in working towards a career in this competitive sector.

The successful candidate will be supporting the SNCV and Biodiversity Team in the day-to-day running of Sutton's nature reserves. The candidate will assist with and lead on practical volunteer days, as well as surveys and monitoring of local wildlife. The Biodiversity Assistant will be involved in engaging the public with the work undertaken by the SNCV and Biodiversity Team; which includes writing regular blog posts and managing social media sites, as well as assisting with environmental events.

The ideal candidate should have a proven interest in nature conservation and a desire to learn new skills. Relevant and appropriate training will be provided. Candidates need to be self-motivated to deal with the busy workload and simultaneous tasks of this role.

This role is a voluntary position but travel expenses will be paid (off-peak 1-6 travelcard or equivalent expenses), as well as any relevant training courses (i.e. first aid, use of power tools, species identification skills). There is no accommodation, so candidates must be within easy reach of South London.

Due to the nature of the role, it is **essential** that candidates have previous experience of undertaking ecology and conservation and a sound understanding of ecological principles. A minimum of 6 months previous practical habitat management experience and some organising and leading on volunteer task days would be expected from the successful candidate to be able to rapidly improve their skill base.

Hours required:

The successful candidate should be able to commit three days a week for 6 months, as a minimum. Candidates must be able to commit to either a Tuesday or Thursday task day, but there is flexibility around the other days. The role involves supporting and running weekend and evening events, as necessary. Remote and flexible working are also (potentially) available.

Main Duties:

- Assisting with habitat management on nature reserves across the London Borough of Sutton
- Organising and leading volunteer task days
- Writing regular blog posts and managing social media accounts
- Assisting with surveys and monitoring of local species,
- In-putting survey data and performing basic analyses
- Maintenance tasks, such as maintaining the tools and workshop
- Assisting with the creation, implementation and review of habitat management plans
- Assisting with environmental education events and activities
- Supporting the Biodiversity Officer with a variety of admin jobs
